

Cattle Shows

Code of Ethics

Ethics are an individual's responsibility, however, it should be understood that violators are subject to disciplinary provisions of the association.

The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and are defined as unethical in show ring of registered cattle.

- Misrepresenting the age of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
- Filling an animal unnaturally with liquid (tubing)
- Balancing the udder by any means other than by leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters.
- Treating the udder, internally or externally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or any other substance to temporally improve conformation of produce unnatural animation.
- Administering epidural anesthesia (blocking tails).
- Performing surgery of any kind to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. Not including the removal of warts, teats and horns, clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves.
- Inserting foreign materials-articles under the skin into the top line or on the feet.
- Roping udders.
- Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or other conduct detrimental to the breed of show.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

Eligibility

- Animals shown at any County shows within the province of Ontario in the current show year including combined shows are ineligible to show at the Oxford County Holstein Show.
- A 4-H project shown in the current 4-H show year by a 4-H member at a previous County or combined show is eligible to show at Oxford County Holstein Show as long as the owner of the animal is an active Oxford County Holstein Breeder and the 4-H member shows the animal.

9. CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION FEMALE: 1ST and 2ND PRIZE WINNERS FROM SECTIONS 1-5 and 7-8.

PRIZE MONEY: Prize money will be awarded only in the 4-H aged calf classes.

10. CHAMPION JUNIOR HERD (Bred by Exhibitor) each animal in the group must have been exhibited in one of the classes for single animals, classes 1-8. A group of three animals limited to one per exhibitor. Exhibitor must have bred all three animals and own at least ONE. The registration certificate for each respective animal must show the exhibitor as "breeder" and as "owner" – in both cases either as an individual or in partnership. In other words the exhibitor may be a "joint owner" of an animal and /or the "joint breeder" of an animal. Note the exception where TWO animals may be owned by another exhibitor.

11. MILKING YEARLING: In milk prior to Aug. 23, 2018

12. Female Jr. 2 year olds Born March 1, 2016 to August 31, 2016

13. Female Sr. 2 year olds Born September 1, 2015 to February 28, 2016

14. Female Jr. 3 year olds Born March 1, 2015 to August 31, 2015

15. Female Sr. 3 year olds Born September 1, 2014 to February 28, 2015

16. Female 4 year old Born September 1, 2013 to August 31, 2014

17. Female 5 year old Born September 1, 2012 to August 31, 2013

18. Female Mature Cow Born prior to September 1, 2008 in milk

19. 60,000 KG and up Class – In milk or dry, if dry must be within approximately 8 weeks of calving. Official "Production Certificate" must accompany animal at ringside showing proof that the animal has produced 60,000 kg of milk or more in her lifetime.

20. CHAMPION BREEDERS HERD (Bred by Exhibitor) each animal in the group must have been exhibited in one of the classes for single animal classes 11-19. A group of three animals limited

to one per exhibitor. Exhibitor must have bred all three animals and own at least ONE. The registration certificate for each respective animal must show the exhibitor as “breeder” and as “owner” – in both cases either as an individual or in partnership. In other words the exhibitor may be a “joint owner” of an animal and /or the “joint breeder” of an animal. Note the exception where TWO animals may be owned by another exhibitor.

21. GRAND AND RESERVE CHAMPION – 1ST AND 2ND PRIZE WINNERS FROM SECTION 11-19. *Banners donated by Floradale Feeds and Darcroft Farms*

22. FUTURITY CLASS Animals entered are to be in the Summer and/or Junior Yearling age classes, and will show in 2019 as a Jr 2yr old. They do not need to be but can be exhibited in 2018, entry fee is paid for the 2019 show. The entry fees will be split 50/50 with the club and the class winner in 2019.

BEST UDDER: Section 11-19 Rosettes will be donated to best udder designated by judge.

BEST BRED AND OWNED: Section 11-19 Rosettes will be donated to animal where the breeder is an owner or joint owner of the animal.

2. Exhibitors are required to pay a fee of \$10.00 and must be enrolled in the Oxford 4-H program.
3. Prize money will be paid in each class only if the judge of the class deems the exhibitor is worthy of the award.
4. Each exhibitor shall be limited to one entry in each class.
5. Each exhibitor will exhibit their project according to the 4-H motto, "LEARN TO DO BY DOING". 4-H Members only will prepare their own projects for competition. If the rules are broken you will be eliminated.
6. Project Animal Identification Form must have been handed in by June 1st Deadline.

Rules and Regulations:

- Entry forms must be completed. Entries and fee may accompany you at the door on Thursday August 23, 2018 between 8-11am. **ENTRY FEES AT THE DOOR APPLY TO THESE 4-H ENTRY CLASSES ONLY!!!!**
- Exhibitors will be required to pay a fee of \$5.00 and can enter as many classes as they wish. Exhibitors must be current paid members of Oxford County 4-H for 2018.

- Each Exhibitor will be limited to one entry in each class.
- Exhibitors will exhibit their own projects according to the 4-H Motto "LEARN TO DO BY DOING". Item must be made by the 4-H member only.
- If there are more than 6 entries in the class it will be split into Clover Buds (6-8), Jr. (9-14) and Sr. (15-21), with the exception of the Exhibit Boards and the Special Class, which will be judged as an entire class with no divisions.
- Exhibits must be worthy to be awarded prize money at the discretion of the judge.
- Entries must be at the fairgrounds between 8am and 11am Thursday, August 23, 2018 and must be removed between 5:30pm and 6pm on Sunday, August 26, 2018.

Class #1 4-H Exhibits (Not previously exhibited, limit of one per project per club or opportunity). These 2 or 3 sided display board exhibits, depicting club activities, projects or opportunities (e.g. *Discovery Days, Future Leaders in Action, Provincial Leadership or Youth Adventure Camp*)

Class #2 Holiday Decoration, depicting any holiday, using any materials

Class #3 Handmade Gift, suitable for an occasion, gift tag included but not wrapped. May be edible.

Class #4 Animal Care Poster, using a full sheet of Bristol board, showing tips on how to care for an animal

Class #5 Four (4) Photos promoting Fair theme "Country Roots & City Boots", each picture size 4"x6", mounted together on one black background, minimum border to be 2cm. Pictures must be taken by exhibitor. No words or captions.

Class #6 Handmade Craft, any handmade item made by exhibitor, examples—sewing, woodworking, knitting, etc, not previously shown at fair.

Class #7 Pollinator Friendly Garden, create a plan for a garden to attract and support pollinators. Show plant varieties, special features (rocks, water, hive, etc.)

Class #8 Recycled/re-purposed craft item made from recycled/re-purposed materials, handmade by exhibitor, not previously shown at fair.

Class #9 Pasta Dish, showcasing an original recipe created by you using at least one pasta product, with ingredient list and preparation method, a photo of the finished dish, and comments from at least two people who ate it.

Class #10 Spiced Apple Muffins (Good Foods Fast 4-H project), three muffins on a disposable plate covered with clear wrap or zippered bag.

375 ml whole wheat flour
125 ml wheat germ
125 ml packed brown sugar
15 ml baking powder
5 ml salt
5 ml cinnamon
2 ml nutmeg
250 ml grated peeled apple
125 ml currants or raisins
125 ml sunflower seeds
2 eggs slightly beaten
175 ml milk
7 ml cooking oil

1. Preheat oven to 200 °C
2. In a large bowl combine flour, wheat germ, sugar, baking powder, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg. Mix well.
3. Stir in apple, currants or raisins and sunflower seeds
4. In another bowl combine eggs, milk and oil.
5. Make a well in the center of the dry ingredients.
6. Add wet ingredients and stir until just moistened.
7. Spoon into nonstick or paper-lined large muffin pans, filling to the top.
8. Bake in oven for 20-25 minutes or until firm to touch.
