### Rules:

- 1. Exhibitors must become a member of the Woodstock Agricultural Society by paying an annual fee of \$10.00 at the time of registration. No membership fees are required for Youth exhibitors.**
- Registration forms and entry tags will be available at the office July 3rd. Registration forms along with membership fee may be mailed to 885 Nellis Street, Woodstock, N4S 4C6, to arrive not later than Tuesday, August 7th.  
Forms and fees may also be dropped off at the Woodstock Fairgrounds office. Office hours are Monday and Thursday 8 am–4 pm, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday 8 am–12:30 pm.  
Registration will be at the Oxford Auditorium on the following dates:  
Saturday, August 11, 9 am–12 pm  
Saturday, August 18, 9 am–12 pm  
Tuesday, August 21, 5–8 pm  
Membership fee of \$10.00 must be paid before registration forms are accepted and entry tags given out.
- ENTRIES will be received 7:30 am to 10:45am on Wednesday, August 22 at the Oxford Auditorium.
- All entries must remain in place until closing; **Sunday, August 26, pick up will be from 5:00 pm-6:00 pm.**
- All work must be clean. No stains. **Each exhibitor is allowed one (1) entry per section.**
- No exhibitor shall exhibit any article which is not the actual work of the exhibitor (except where noted).
- All Homecraft Division awards for most points may be won 2 consecutive years only. Following the 3rd year exhibitors are again eligible to win most points awards.
- All judge’s decisions are final.
- Judges are instructed to award prizes to new and up-to-date work. Work that has been shown more than 2 consecutive years will be disqualified. Please identify your work on the back of your claim ticket.
- Directors will **take every precaution** to ensure the safety of the articles sent to the exhibition. The owner takes the risk of exhibiting. Should an article be lost or stolen, the directors will offer all the assistance in their power towards its recovery; the society will not make any payment of the value thereof.

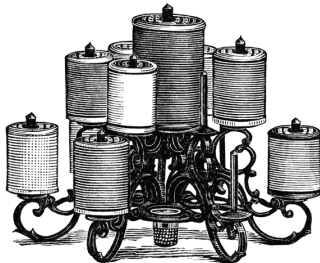

### QUILTING

#### OAAS – Hand Quilted Quilt Eligibility, Rules and Regulations:

- A. Entries must be solely made and hand quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) Fair to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Entry quilts must be a minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter (smaller quilts will not be eligible to proceed to next level of competition)
- C. The winners name and pattern to be displayed at the Fair on a sign provided by OAAS
- D. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- E. Upon making an entry into the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies quilt Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- F. The winning Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Quilt Competition will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or OAAS Competition.
- G. Local Fair is entitled to send only the Grand Champion Quilt (min 324" measured on the perimeter) judged the best of show of all hand quilted quilts to the District Competition.

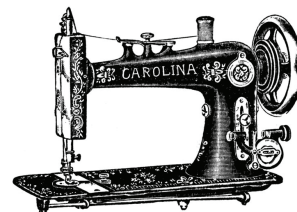

#### OAAS – Machine-Quilted Quilt Eligibility, Rules and Regulations:

- A. Entries must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) Fair to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Quilt to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter to be a minimum of 324". Note the quilt can be square, rectangular etc.
- C. The winners name and pattern to be displayed at the Fair on a sign provided by OAAS
- D. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Machine-Quilted quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- E. Upon making an entry into the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Machine Quilting Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- F. The winning Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Machine-Quilted Quilt Competition will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or OAAS Competition.
- G. Quilt must have visible machine quilting
- H. Local Fair is entitled to send only one Grand Champion Machine-Quilted Quilt, judged the best of show of all eligible machine-quilted quilts to the District Competition.

"Beginner" meaning first year of quilting and never having exhibited their work prior to the fair.

15. Machine quilted - tote
16. Machine quilted- table runner
17. Machine quilted – Throw Pillow, appliquéd

maximum 72" perimeter
19. Hand quilted – block, 1 only, any pattern,  
12" square including border

20. Machine quilted tree skirt

22. Hand quilted table runner with  
2 matching place mats
23. Hand quilted wall hanging – cheater  
panel or pieced, your choice – machine  
appliquéd

**MISCELLANEOUS QUILTING**

24. Machine quilted oven mitts
25. Machine quilted tote with hand  
appliquéd pocket
26. Machine quilted table runner  
– any season
27. Hand quilted – two (2) place mats  
– any season
28. Machine quilted – hot pads, coordinat-  
ed, 1 patterned, 1 solid
29. Quilted blocks – top only, 1 machine  
quilted, 1 hand quilted, label each block

**NOTE: Ready to hang means loops or sleeves  
sewn on the back of the quilted piece**
